Subject : Use of SECC data for eligible households for IAY assistance

Dear

You may be aware that in Indira Awaas Yojana selection of beneficiaries is being done on the basis of a Permanent Waitlist. The Permanent Waitlist was prepared based on the BPL list of 2002. Many States subsequently raised the issue of the Permanent Waitlist being exhausted. The Ministry had issued directions for adding eligible households to the BPL List and the Permanent Waitlist vide letter dated 27/10/2013.

2. Separately Government had launched the Socio Economic Caste Census 2011 exercise, which has been completed in many States and the final list has been published. The Ministry of Rural Development has now decided to allow the use of SECC data for beneficiary selection under IAY operationalising the provision to use the SECC as the baseline data provided in para 4.3 of the scheme guideline. Norms for use of the SECC 2011 data for beneficiary selection has been devised and described in Annexe 1.

3. Your views on whether such a standard national norm is mandated, recommendations on the parameters chosen and weights assigned and any additions and deletions to the list are solicited. You are requested to kindly send in your comment/suggestions latest by the 30th April, 2015. They may also be sent by e-mail to bc1958@gmail.com or kokila.jayaram@nic.in.

Annexe 1

Procedure to generate list of eligible households for IAY assistance

Step 1: Follow the double stage exclusion process

Step 2: Prepare separate list for SC, ST, Minority and Others following the parameters and weighting scheme shown below.

Sl. No.	Parameter	Weighting scheme
1.	Houseless	2
2.	Destitute / living on alms	2
3.	If a member of the household is from a Primitive Tribal Group, a legally released bonded labourer, a manual scavenger	2
4.	Zero or one room house with kutcha wall (kutcha as per definition above)	2
5.	Zero or one room house with kutcha roof (kutcha as per definition above)	2
6.	Households with transgender persons	1
7.	Women headed households with no adult male member between age 16 and 59	1
8.	Households with no adult member between age 16 and 59	1
9.	Any member with a disability (Disability to be certified by a process chosen by State)	1
10.	Households with a single girl child	1
	Total	15

Step 3: Rank families based on their scores. This would be treated as the Category wise priority list

Step 4: An annual select list to be finalised based on the priority list and other priority group inclusions, restricting to the annual target assigned to the Gram Panchayat. Priority group inclusions are households namely widows and next-of-kin of members of defence/paramilitary /police forces killed in action, households where a member is suffering from leprosy or cancer and people living with HIV.

Step 5: This annual select list has to be placed before the Gram Sabha for approval.
